



VIETNAM'S EDUCATION SECTOR JOIN FIGHT TO END DOG AND CAT MEAT TRADE

In the last edition of the *Soi Dog Post*, we shared with you the news that Vietnam's traditional medicine community had unanimously denounced the use of dog and cat meat for medicinal purposes.

The landmark move came at a workshop in the capital Hanoi led by Soi Dog, social behaviour change agency Intelligentmedia and the official voice of traditional medicine practitioners in Vietnam, VOTMA.

Just a few months on from that important development, we're thrilled to share that another of Vietnam's most influential sectors is following suit – the education sector.

At a separate workshop also organised by Soi Dog and Intelligent media, in partnership with the Hanoi Department of Education and Training, teachers from more than 30 secondary schools in Hanoi met in November.



Together, they discussed the most effective ways to educate the next generation about the ethical and health implications of the dog and cat meat trade as well as the importance of responsible pet ownership and rabies prevention.

The workshop was met with an enthusiastic response from teaching staff who, within days, were integrating the issues into their curriculum by way of reading materials, group discussion and roleplaying activities!

No one group or organisation can influence social change alone, particularly with an issue as deep-rooted as dog and cat meat consumption. It takes multiple sectors of society, working continuously towards a shared goal.

With your support, we will continue to engage sectors from across Vietnamese society – from the highest levels of government to grassroots campaigners – to build a brighter and kinder future for the country's companion animals.



VOLUNTEER'S HANDCRAFTED CAT TREES TRANSFORM SOI DOG CATTERY

At the Gill Dalley Sanctuary, a work of compassion recently unfolded at the skilful hands and caring heart of one remarkable volunteer – *Markus Engler*.

A semi-professional triathlete from Switzerland, Markus traded his running shoes for work boots and, over the course of a few weeks, dedicated his time to crafting six beautiful cat trees for our feline friends.

This wasn't Markus' first rodeo. In 2019, he built five scratching posts for our cattery. However, he returned this time with a bigger vision: to spoil our cats with stronger, multi-levelled cat trees made from sustainable materials.

Markus teamed up with *Nui* from our maintenance team, and together they meticulously designed and assembled six cat trees from scratch – one for each of our five cat suites and another for our nearby FIV house.

Nui, used to the sound of metal, found a new rhythm in the buzz of woodworking tools and learnt fresh techniques he can use for future shelter projects.

LEARNING TOGETHER

In an effort to enhance veterinary knowledge and stray animal welfare, Soi Dog Foundation recently signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with Thailand's leading veterinary institution.

Soi Dog has worked with Kasetsart University's Faculty of Veterinary Medicine on a number of projects over the years. However, the MOU marks our first official cooperation.

The cooperation will facilitate an exchange of academic knowledge and expertise between us.

Students of the university, for example, will gain practical experience by spending time at our hospitals and assisting with treatment. With animals arriving every day with complex injuries and illnesses, there are plenty of valuable case studies to learn from.

At the same time, Soi Dog vets can learn from faculty experts who will share the latest advancements in veterinary science and techniques for animal care.



Since the MOU signing, we have already had the pleasure of hosting a group of vet interns at our hospitals: sixth-year students *Noey, Meem* and *Cream*.



Noey enjoyed her time in the sterilisation suite the most as it enabled her to engage with the local community and educate them about stray animal care while also making a meaningful difference to reducing overpopulation.

Meem, meanwhile, relished her time in our hospitals. In addition to learning new surgical techniques, she found helping our dogs and cats grow healthier and happier to be deeply rewarding.

For Cream, it was the opportunity to learn about shelter management that interested her the most, alongside performing thorough routine health checks on our sanctuary residents.

However, we will also remember 2023 for another milestone and a few very special events too...


200,000!

In November, just a few months after reaching the all-time total of a million, we neutered and vaccinated our 200,000th animal for the year.

This was significant as it was the first time we reached this number in a single calendar year!

2023 was also the year we participated in not one, not two but three royal events!

As you may remember from previous editions of the *Soi Dog Post*, Her Royal Highness Princess *Chulabhorn Krom Phra Srisavangavadhana* has long championed efforts to make Thailand rabies-free, most notably through her 'Disease-Free Animals, Rabies-Free People' project.

We were proud to participate in one of the project's events in July and even prouder to be invited back again later in the year.

In October, at the invitation of Kasetsart University's Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, we joined a sterilisation and vaccination event in Udon Thani, a province with a strong track record of rabies control.

Just a month later, our Bangkok mobile vets headed to Nakhon Ratchasima to work with the Chulabhorn Volunteer Veterinary Unit at Kasetsart University Animal Hospital to help manage the overpopulation of dogs at Nawaminthakasatriyathirat Air Force Academy.
