JOB DESCRIPTION

Job Title and Summary: This Veterinary Surgeon (Bangkok Mobile) will work under the guidance of the Bangkok Mobile Veterinary Manager and will travel with the Mobile Clinic around Greater Bangkok, performing mass sterilisations of free roaming dogs and cats. The vet will be trained in high-volume, high-quality spay/ neuter in Bangkok (3 months training) and then will be prepared to be stationed anywhere in Bangkok Metropolitan area. This vet will also perform ancillary soft-tissue procedures, treat sick and injured dogs and cats, and communicate with the public regarding importance of sterilisation.

Key Responsibilities:

- Perform safety sterilisation under SDF technique in both sexes of street dogs and cats.
- Meet daily target of minimum 20 dogs or 30 cats sterilised per vet per day (after 3 months' training period) and can increase to 25 dogs or 40 cats sterilised per vet per day include complication case such as Pyometra, Cryptorchidism, Abortion, etc.
- Perform euthanasia and terminate pregnancies when warranted.
- Perform soft-tissue procedure, treat sick and injured dogs and cats when there is necessity.
- Manage emergencies and post-op complication cases as they present to the clinic.
- Follow SDF protocols and policies are being followed, working to the highest possible medical standards.
- Perform, decide and guidance with nurse for administer treatments (injections, CPR, oral medications, fluid therapy, wound dressings and first aid).
- Health check and monitoring animal condition when entering the mobile unit, before placing anaesthesia drug, during animal preparation, during surgery, after surgery and recovery period.
- Observe, analyse and solve daily problems at mobile clinic daily.
- Communicate with community, feeders and owners regarding responsible pet ownership and the importance of sterilisation.
- As part of the Soi Dog team, be available to help as needed, even with tasks that are outside of the job description.

Department and Supervisor: CNVR Bangkok Mobile and report to Bangkok Mobile Veterinary Manager

Skills and Qualifications:

- Thai nationality only.
- Must have a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree and valid license to practice veterinary medicine in Thailand.
- Work experience not necessary, but must be willing to train in high-volume, high-quality spay/neuter.
- Passionate about animal welfare and willing to learn.
- Fair English communication skills and must work well with a diverse staff.

Location: Training in Bangkok Clinic (first 3 months), then could be stationed all over Greater Bangkok and vicinity (Nonthaburi, Nakhon Pathom, Pathum Thani, Samut Prakan, Samut Sakhon) and Chachoengsao.

Type of Employment: Full time position.
